

Bhopal Disaster: 36 Years in the Shadow of Tragedy



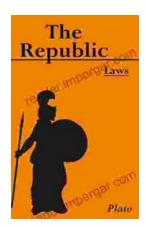

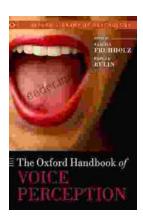
