War

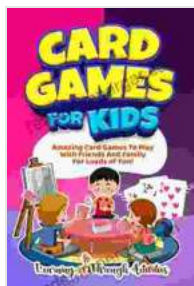
War is a simple but exciting card game that's perfect for young kids. It helps kids practice their number recognition and counting skills.

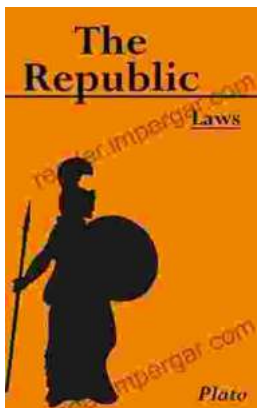

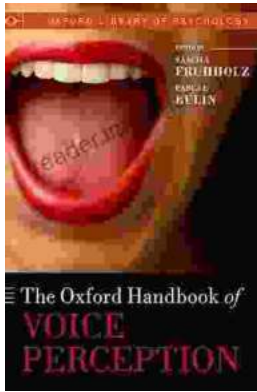
