

- Link Iraq to Iran. Iran is the concern. If we fail in Iraq or Afghanistan, it
 will help Iran.
- . "We fight there so we won't have to fight here at home."
- Go on the offense. Push back, rather than simply defending. We can't win
 on defense.
- We are at war. It is a test of wills. The center of gravity is in the U.S., not in Iraq. Perseverance = Victory.






